

Guide Line for Authors

1. The author of the research paper/article must submit the following materials to the Editor :
 - a) Three computer printed copies of the manuscript, printed on one side of A4 size paper with proper margin.
 - b) CD of the printed paper (MS Word in one single file with tables, figures, graphs etc.)
 - c) Short running title.
 - d) The processing fee of Rs. 5000 or US\$ 250 per research paper/article.
2. At the bottom of the first page, the postal address of the corresponding author and co-author(s), along with the Departmental address with designation, Tel. No, Fax No, E-mail ID etc. must be specified.
3. The article forwarded to the Editor for publication is understood to be offered to the Journal exclusively. It is also understood that the authors have obtained the prior approval of their Department, Faculty or Institute where such approval is necessary. Submission will also imply that all the named co-authors have agreed to the work being sent out for peer-review and possibly publication, and that they have no undeclared competing financial interests.
4. The acceptance of the manuscript for publication in the Journal shall automatically mean transfer of copyright to the journal. The Editorial Board takes no responsibility for the fact or the opinion expressed in the Journal, which rests entirely with the author(s) thereof.
5. The common causes for the papers being rejected are:
 - (i) that they report a single small or incomplete experiment that makes a minor or uncertain contribution to new knowledge or understanding,
 - (ii) that the data are statistically insignificant and / or do not support the claims being made,
 - (iii) that they are written so poorly, without references to these and the more detailed instructions for authors, and
 - (iv) that they are incomprehensible.
6. The same data should not be presented in tables and figures both.
7. The authors are requested to send their research articles strictly according to the format mentioned in the guidelines to the authors.
8. The author is required to ensure that their research paper/articles are written in correct English language free from grammatical, linguistic and typographical errors, failing which article/ paper may not be accepted by the editorial board
